## **Independence Day Celebrated at KPT**



## Federal Minister for Ports & Shipping Senator Kamran Michael Announced the Charter of Demand of KPT Employees











The Federal Minister for Ports and Shipping Senator Kamran Michael announced the Charter of Demand at a large gathering of KPT Employees in KPT Head Office on 20th August 2015. Salaries of KPT Employees are raised after every two years through a Charter of Demand. The period covered under the announced Charter of Demand is from 1st April 2014 to 30th March 2016. The new CBA "KPT Workers Union" presented this Charter of Demand to **KPT** Management. While speaking on the occasion, the Minister Kamran Michael stressed upon making the organization more profitable. He said that he is happy to see the organization on the right track and referring to statistics he pointed out that record cargo handling has taken place in KPT last year when it broke its previous records to register a handling of 43.42 million tonnes cargo. The Minister said that cargo handling of KPT in the first two months of this financial year (i.e. July - August 2015) remained at 6.730 million tonnes as compared to the corresponding period of last year when the port recorded handling of 5.488 million tonnes. Hence, shows an increase of 22.64% more cargo this year while handling 1.242 million tonnes more cargo, he added. The Minister Kamran Michael stressed on having further improvements in performance and said that KPT is capable of handling enormous berths cargoes at its and

handling 253 ships in the first two months of this financial year is a significant proof of your capabilities as in the corresponding period of last year



ship handling remained at 216. He concluded while underlining the importance of ports and said that KPT plays a vital role in economic growth of Pakistan.

### **Government Pledges to Improve Shipping Industry**



Federal Minister for Ports & Shipping Senator Kamran Michael said that the government is aware of the issues confronting shipping logistics and supply chain industry and would ensure that all the stakeholders work in tandem.

Speaking as a chief guest at a conference in a local hotel on 19th August 2015, he said that the government has a vision to make the country economically strong by developing infrastructure and assured to take professional suggestions into account.

"Logistics role is crucial in trade and its efficiency directly affects the cost of doing business and end-product prices." The minister said that the government is keen to accelerate the pace of growth and mentioned progress on China-Pakistan Economic Corridor and also pledged



to identify locations for setting up private warehouses and cold storage units at ports. He also mentioned that the new scanners are being installed at all ports to cut clearance time

Mr. Michael further informed that a European Union delegation is visiting Karachi Fisheries this month to clear five more companies for exports. EU lifted the ban on fish imports from Pakistan after seven years and cleared two companies in this regard three months back.

The minister said that speed boats for fast movement of perishable cargo from Karachi to Gulf countries are being arranged, which would help reduce freight cost without compromising on quality of goods like fresh vegetables and fruits. "These boats would reach Gulf ports within 20 to 30 hours", he added.






## Korean Officials of Ministry of Ocean & Fisheries Visited Karachi Port

Effective communication is an important part of the EHS Management System (EHS-MS). - 1. Aspect / Incident Reporting This is an important part of EHS Management System that is enforced in Karachi Port Trust. This is mutual handling function that will be handled by each department and take action at their respective levels as per the guidelines given in the EHS-MS.
- 2. Formation of Communication Service Team The purpose of the team will be to identify and plan for EHS-MS communication needs and to initiate action or provide assistance to ensure these needs are met. The document will give more details on it while focusing on communication plan, EHS related pages in Quarterly KPT Newsletter, placement of newsletter of KPT on KPT and EHS websites, various port oriented event manage ment activities, etc, etc will be covered in detail.
- 3. Communication Tools A variety of tools will be made available to the EHS Office (MR / Dy. MR offices)

- of KPT such as usage of EHS Website, EHS Office Intranet, EHS meetings for discussing emerging issues, EHS training, etc, etc will be given coverage in detail in the said policy document.
- 4. Communication with stakeholders and regulatory authorities The is a critical component that will accommodate and facilitate a two way communication between EHS-MS and the stakeholders / federal and local regulatory authorities with respect to day to day matters. This part of policy document will also cover visits by stakeholders to port area of KPT. Even the visit of regulatory authorities like Oil Spill Response teams will be handled through making the existing document EHS compliant according to given guidelines of EHS-MS.
- 5. Community involvement and outreach This part of the document will deal with developing communication and rapport with the general public will be taken care off. Tools like print publications and various talk shows be used to convey message to general public an issues of gross importance. Even supplements and promotional advertisements be planned while remaining in the purview of this part of the document. Various days like Earth Day, World Environment Day, World Maritime Day, etc, etc be planned while remaining within the guidelines of EHS-MS.

An eighty years old lady, Sarwari Begum, resident of Buffer Zone, Karachi was blind due to total corneal opacity since many years and was brought to KPT Hospital. After a thorough examination by the

dedicated team of specialists she was operated successfully. She is the first patient who underwent Corneal Transplant at KPT Hospital. The cornea donor is International Eye Bank of Srilanka.

The Surgery has completely changed eighty years old Sarwari's life and she has so much more to look forward to her life. Now according to Surgeon Muhammad Shafique Khan, the vision has completely restored.

This achievement is possible by the dedicated team of doctors and keen interest of the Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Azam Khawaja. The Eye Surgeon is ambitious to serve more and provide standard eye care to the KPT's employee and others



















#### KPT hosted Cruise Dinner for Pakistan Women Cricket Team

- 4. Wearing of helmet campaign in Port area is continue




