## Chairman KPT Inspected Oil Piers



The Chairman KPT Vice Admiral Shafqat Jawed visited the project site of Oil Pier-1, 2 & 3 on 27th June 2014 where he was briefed about the overall structure, operative problems and the short term redressing made as per requirement from time to time. He was informed that the existing structure of OP-1 is 34 years old and had already outlived its life. The pier was constructed way back during the period 1975 – 78.

The Chairman KPT was informed that the overall structure was in dilapidated condition and especially during the last three monsoon the condition have further worsened which forced the KPT to make repairs through contract, to enable it to remain operational for Port use. The Chairman appreciated the efforts of Engineering Department for keeping the structure in workable / operational condition through timely repairs of outlived structures in wake of harsh and rough sea conditions.





## Progress Reviews of Berth 15-17A Project



The Chairman KPT Vice Admiral Shafqat Jawed inspected the project site of Berth 15-17A project of KPT at East Wharves, on 27th June 2014. He reviewed the progress made by the consultants M/s Atkins of UK. The project of reconstruction of berths 15-17A also includes the two ship repair berths (SRB 1&2) was briefed to Chairman KPT by the Chief Resident Engineer Mr. Richard G. Baker, of M/s Atkins of UK, who informed that the completion of the said project will provide a berthing length of 930 Lenient meter to facilitate the post panamax container vessels of 70,000 Dead Weight Tonnage (DWT) and bulk carriers of 100,000 DWT that would call on Karachi Port. The draft available at berths to these vessels would be a depth of 16 meters Karachi Port Detum (KPD). These berths will provide 75,000 sq. m apron and backup area for cargo handling and storage capacity to both, the bulk and containers, and berths 15-17A, 17B, 17C will be equipped with all utility services and environment & fire protection

Mr. Richard further informed the Chairman that work

on project was started in July 2012 by a Korean joint venture company “Ssangyong & Dongyang” and it is expected that work on three berths 15, 16 and 17 will attain completion in October 2014 and that commencement of Port operation will start immediately as soon as these got completed. He further informed Chairman KPT that the remaining berths 17A, 17B and 17C will attain completion next year in June 2015 to facilitate more berthing space for vessels calling at Karachi Port.

The Chairman Vice Admiral Shafqat advised both the Consultant M/s Atkins of UK and Contractor M/s Ssangyong & Dongyang to expedite the work and to handover all the berths as early as possible so that the completed berths can be made operational.

Later, the Chairman Vice Admiral Shafqat inspected the works in progress to ascertain its quality. He inspected various sections of the ongoing work and showed satisfaction on the quality of work.

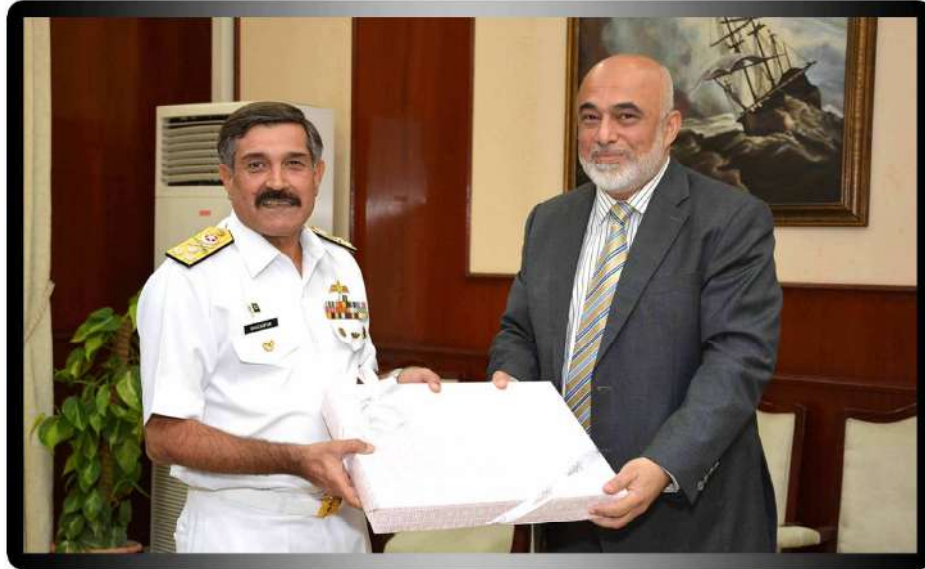

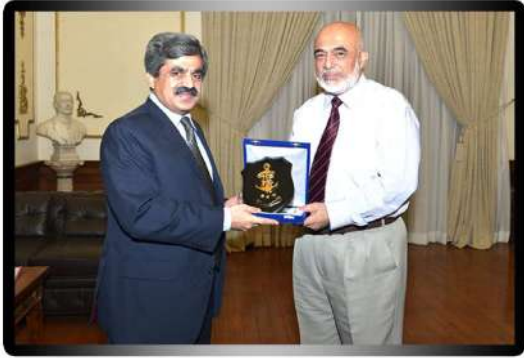

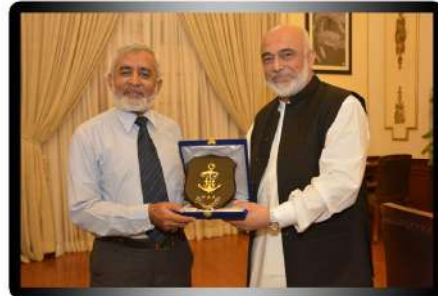

## *KPT participated in Marine Exhibition & Mela*



The growing humanitarian needs are certainly required to be addressed in the best possible manner but this fulfillment process is consuming mother-nature's resources at an alarming rate which is fast upsetting balance, highlighted by Mr. Fayyaz Rasool, Manager Marine Pollution Control Department, Karachi Port Trust. He was sharing his views with participants/visitors of stall of KPT, displayed on the occasion of a two day Marine Exhibition & Mela organized by the Institute of Marine Sciences, University of Karachi. He stressed further to do more for our environment to maintain balance and that we need to create awareness among people to inculcate understanding of nature's true importance. Mr. Fayyaz said that being a keen follower of Marine Sciences, he intends to shed light on the fragility of marine eco-system which faces the dumping of raw pollution and has become a huge cause of concern which is continuously harming aquatic life.

Highlighting KPT's efforts, Mr. Fayyaz said that there is another type of pollution which the Karachi Port faces is caused by ships. The slurry or oily material discharged by ships deliberately or by accident are strictly taken care off by MPCD. He said our practices include both the remedial measures, which include deployment of oil spill response team and equipment, as well as penalizing the polluters according to "Polluter Pays" principle.

The MPCD team displayed oil spill response equipments

and explained the visitors how and what kinds of measures are deployed for curbing marine pollution at Karachi Harbour. The equipments included oil curtailing air inflated Booms, Dispersant spray pump and its shooting gun, Oil Skimmers (used for sucking oil from sea), life buoys and jackets. Moreover, mangroves



were also displayed at the stall for creating awareness about this unique plant that is not only provides a nursery for Shrimps and Fish but also digest liquids that are harmful for marine habitat thus proves instrumental in lowering pollution level of the sea as well as being a defender from storms. Due to this unique display, MPCD's stall remained the most visited by both the students and the academia and efforts of KPT for keeping the environment safe was well appreciated.

### ***KPT to plant 100,000 mangroves plants in four months – speedy work underway***

In pursuance to the task assigned by the Federal Minister for Ports and Shipping Senator Kamran Michael, KPT is plating 100,000 mangroves in four months as per the ministry orders. The MPC Department of KPT has in the first phase channeled out efforts for establishing mangroves nursery of a capacity of providing thirty thousand plants at a time for the implementation of "Mangrove Plantation Campaign 2014". The task was not an easy to achieve in such a short time, yet a target has been set to make it a reality deploying the total staff strength as well as the daily wages personnel of Marine Pollution Control Department for achieving this daunting task. It is hoped that by the grace of Almighty ALLAH, it will be accomplished during the announced deadline.



## MIS Department - The First to Get ISO Certified in KPT



The Management Information System Department (MIS Department) becomes the first department in Karachi Port Trust to obtain ISO certification “ISO 9001:2008”. The certification covers software designing, hardware & network support and services of Information & technology areas / functions of the MIS Department. The certification issued this year to KPT will remain valid till 2017.

This certification has made the KPT the first in Ports and Shipping sector to have an international Quality Management certification and reflects on the professionalism as well as procedural formalities at par with the international standards.

The port has set its course towards the right direction and a system has started in KPT to make it quality and environment compliant. Our focus has poised us to achieve and become transshipment hub of the South Asian region.

## Facilities at KPT Hospital Upgraded



Recently and with passage of time the facilities at KPT Hospital have gradually been upgraded to provide better services to employees and officers of KPT. The hospital which came into being in 1965 with 40 beds, including maternity wing, has today 186 beds and provides specialist services today in the areas of pathology, radiology, ENT, dermatology, dental, gynecology and ophthalmology.

In pursuit of continual advancement of facilities, the hospital has recently procured a new executive delivery table with hydraulic function a resuscitation trolley with all accessories for immediate first aid in labour room for the new born babies. The hospital has become capable of providing 24 hours service in Gynae where a new vacuum extractor for providing assistance in delivery cases has been also added along with other equipment like Cardiotocography Machine (CTG) with twin CTG Selection and two Fetal Dopplers for patients are also provided.

### Intensive Care Unit (ICU)

A state of the art Multi Parameter Patient Monitor is installed in Operation Theatre to monitor the cardiac status during surgery of patients in the operation theatre. An Autoclave has also been acquired for proper sterilization purpose. In addition to this an Arterial Blood Gases' machine (ABG's), a new introduction in ICU which will give a clear line for decision making at the time of exposing patients on ventilators has also been procured. Through this machine, a procedure for taking out blood samples directly from femoral arteries to check the certain Carbon dioxide and Oxygen concentration in patients suffering from chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and cardiac myopathy / valves pumping capacity has become possible for patients.



## *KPT Removed Fresh Encroachments from Gulshan e Sikandarabad and Machar Colony*



*I*n a bid to remove encroachments from KPT land, the Anti-Encroachment Cell of KPT patrolled the area on 19th August 2014 which remained very successful for KPT as far as controlling encroachments including that which has been made on KPT land, removal of unauthorized RCC and other constructions from Machar Colony as well as from Gulshan-e-Sikandarabad.

During this inspection, the Anti-Encroachment staff on duty found dumpers busy in dumping in sea at Sikandarabad area. The staff also found encroachment through construction of Courtyard in the area and demolished the compound wall where construction work was going on at that time. In an earlier visit of the area the anti-encroachment staff saw the unauthorized construction work of compound walls between KMC Filter Plant area and at Gali No. 6 as well as at Block No. 5 and Street No.

7 where encroachers carried out unauthorized construction of compound walls which were all demolished by the anti-encroachment staff of KPT.

Similarly, the anti-encroachment team patrolled the area of Machar Colony on 25th June 2014 and demolished unauthorized construction from the area.



The area was again patrolled on 4th July 2014 and it was found that encroachers have again made unauthorized construction in the area as was before and had demolished again the illegal constructions from Machar Colony.
